## **Liberal Arts**

**Seminar Description:** This two-week seminar will examine several topics that have both historical and modern implications. Students will utilize their critical reading skills in order to formulate their own opinions on topics that are relevant to the United States in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. The modalities of learning that will take place include critical reading, guided lecture, and oral discussion. Students will explore the evolution of immigration in America from the early 19<sup>th</sup> century to the current policies of President Donald Trump. Students will then examine the root causation of revolutions in the Western world and determine whether revolutions are an acceptable mechanism of political change. Lastly, students will formulate opinions on what are the differences between a terrorist and a freedom fighter.
